**Obverse:** Bareheaded bust of Kitchener in uniform, right. Legend on a band above: "HONOUR THE BRAVE" and below between "IN OUR MEMORY HE LIVES".

**Reverse:** "KITCHENER'S COMMAND (in an arc) / TO US ALL / CARRY ON / SOLDIER & MAN / CLOSED / HIS LIFE / \* JUNE 5 1916 \* (in an arc)".

**Notes:** Field Marshal Horatio Herbert Kitchener, 1st Earl Kitchener (1850 - 1916) was Chief of Staff in the initial stages of the Boer War and succeeded Lord Roberts as commander-in-chief during the guerrilla phase.

In 1914, at the start of the First World War, Lord Kitchener became Secretary of State for War. Kitchener was killed on 5 June 1916 when the armoured cruiser, HMS Hampshire, taking him to negotiations in Russia was sunk by a German mine.
