Obverse: Crowned and robed bust of the King, right. National flowers of Great Britain below. Across on the left: "1902" and the right: "KING / OF / GREAT / BRITAIN & IRE- / -LAND / . EMPER- / -OR OF / INDIA / (ornament)". Legend on the left: "EDWARD VII". Ornament at the top.

Reverse: Coat of arms of Grahamstown with thistle, shamrocks and two roses around. On a ribbon across: "D. KNIGHT (left) M.A. (right)". On a ribbon above: "CITY OF GRAHAMSTOWN". Below a laurel wreath behind a cartouche: "TO COMMEMORATE THE CORONATION OF / HIS MAJESTY / KING EDWARD VII / JUNE 26, 1902".

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
