**Edge:** Plain.

**Obverse:** Conjugate crowned busts of the King and Queen, right, he robed. Signed: "E. FUCHS / 1901" on a diagonal above the shoulder on the left. Signed: "ELKINGTON" on the truncation. Legend: "KING EDWARD VII QUEEN ALEXANDRA".

**Reverse:** Coat of arms of Cape Colony, antelope supporters and Hope crest with motto on a ribbon below: "SPIES BONA". In an above around: ". TO COMMEMORATE THE CORONATION OF ." then across: "OF / HIS MAJESTY / KING EDWARD" below the arms in arcs: "26TH. JUNE 1902 / RONDEBOSCH".

**Notes:** Similar to Laidlaw 0296 for Cape Town and 0427 for Wynberg.
