Notes: King Edward VIII (1894-1972) was the eldest son of King George V and Queen Mary. Edward became king when his fa in early 1936. He abdicated in December of that year in favour of marriage to the American divorcee Wallis Simpson. T coronation commemorated on this medal never took place. His younger brother was crowned King George VI later in 19
